New prairie dog colony gets upgraded digs at the zoo

ABILENE, TEXAS – After several weeks of renovations, the prairie dog exhibit at the Abilene Zoo is once again filled with the activity of these energetic rodents.

Eight new animals from the El Paso Zoo, ranging in age from five years old to less than a year were added to the exhibit.

To prepare for their arrival, zoo keepers created some man-made tunnels and sleeping dens. New signage that includes information about prairie dog colonies in the wild also was added.



"Prairie dogs are famously entertaining to watch, and we're glad to have this species back on exhibit," said Executive Director Bill Gersonde. "They are a Texas native and play an important role in the ecosystem of the North American grasslands."

Something fun to keep in mind when you watch the new colony: Prairie dogs greet each other by touching teeth.
